Our 2017 graduates again finished with over \$3 million dollars in scholarship money earned with Dorchester County Public Schools pushing past the \$6 million dollar mark for the first time. This is attributed to the hard work of our students, staff, community and of course parent/family support creating College and Career Ready students. A great deal of activity is taking place at Cambridge-South Dorchester High this summer:

- ◆ **Renovations of the entire HVAC system is a priority which is shutting the building down for the majority of the summer except for the main office.**
- ◆ **The main office will be open from 8am-4pm each day.**
- ◆ **There will be at least one guidance counselor available on Tuesdays, Wednesdays, and Thursdays throughout most of the summer. Please DON'T call the school requesting a students' schedule, they will not be ready until August.**
- ◆ **July 3-6, 2017 the main office will be closed for staff vacations**
- ◆ **ALL Fridays during the summer, DCPS will be closed for energy conservation measures.**

With this information, please keep in mind that we will try to return phone calls as we receive them on the same day, but staff vacation time will be taking place; thus phone calls may not be as timely.

During the summer, we will be awaiting the arrival of Dr. Mitchell, our new superintendent for Dorchester County Public Schools. With the beginning of a new Superintendent's tenure, there are always some tweaks to what our new educational leader will bring to promote educational success of our students. I, along with you, am looking forward to what her experience will bring to the county.

With that in mind, I have purposely held off on some of our schedule building until I have a chance to meet with her in July to make sure the Cambridge-South Dorchester High School educational vision meets with her expectations.

Student Dues
