## Dorchester County Public Schools Participating in the Summer Food Service Program

The *Dorchester County Public Schools* is participating in the Summer Food Service Program. Meals will be provided to all children without charge. Acceptance and participation requirements for the Program and all activities are the same for all regardless of race, color, national origin, sex, age, or disability. There will be no discrimination in the course of the meal service. Meals will be provided at the sites and times as follows:

Mace's Lane Middle School, 1101 Mace's Lane, Cambridge, Maryland 21613

Hurlock Elementary School, Sandy Hill Elementary, Maple Elementary School and Mace's Lane Middle School will participate in the Summer Food Service Program from Monday, July 8, 2019 through Thursday, August 1, 2019. Please note schools are **closed** on all Fridays. Mealtimes are Breakfast 8:00 a.m. to 9:00 a.m. and lunch from 11:00 a.m. to 12:00 p.m.
